Next SBMUG Meeting

Thursday, May 18, 6 pm, at the Goleta Library. This month's presentation is all about Apple's brand new OS, called Tiger. Andrew Heuchert from Apple will be on hand to show us all the great new features of Tiger. Be sure to be at the meeting, it's going to be great. June's meeting is about communications (e-mail, iChat, video chat), presented by Program Chairman Dirk Reynolds.

Tiger Tips—Dashboard: The System Preferences (Dashboard & Exposé pane) allow you to set a default keystroke that displays the Dashboard widgets. By default it is the F12 key. iBooks, and smaller Powerbooks combine the F12 key with the eject key, so you may need to press and hold the fn key to change the function from eject to F12.

Tiger Tips—Spotlight: Open a new window in the Finder and type some text into the search box. Spotlight will display files, folders, images, PDF documents, and mail messages that match the search text. Add search critera, to reduce the number of matching files, by clicking on the + (plus) button. Click the save button and the Spotlight search will be saved as a smart folder on the left column of any Finder window. Click on the little "i" icon to the right of any found file to display its info window.

Tiger Tips—**Dictionary**: Highlight a word in any application (by doubleclicking on it) and press the ctrl key and click and hold down the mouse button (or right-button-click and hold the mouse button) and choose "Look up in Dictionary." Double-click any word in the dictionary definition to define that word.

Tiger Tips—System Preferences: Type a letter or two into the Spotlight search box in System Preferences (which is in the Apple menu). See a list of topics to choose from. As you choose topics, the spotlight(!) focuses on different panes to choose from. Type in topic words, such as "TCP," "sleep," or "speaker" to spotlight the pane to choose for more info.

Tiger Tips—Slideshows: Choose a set of image files in a folder. ctrl-click (or right click) and choose "Slideshow" from the Pop-up menu.

A full-screen slideshow begins to play. Move the mouse to see a list of controls. In Mail, if you receive an e-mail message with images attached, click the "slideshow" button in the message header to see a full-screen slideshow. Click a control button to import the currently displayed image to iPhoto.

Tiger Tips—**PDF:** In any application, Choose print from the File menu. In the Print dialog box, locate the PDF button. A pop-up menu shows a list of things you can do with your printout. You can e-mail it, fax it, or save it as a pdf document.
